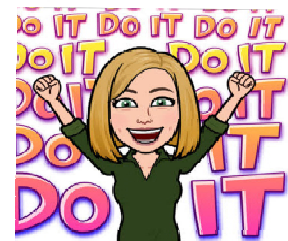
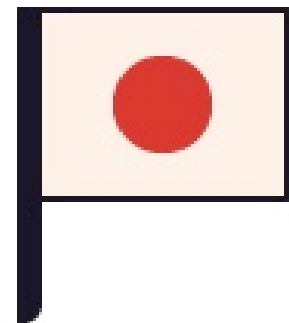
Please remember the best thing you can do for your child's education is to ensure they attend school regularly. We also encourage the wearing of our school uniform all year round.

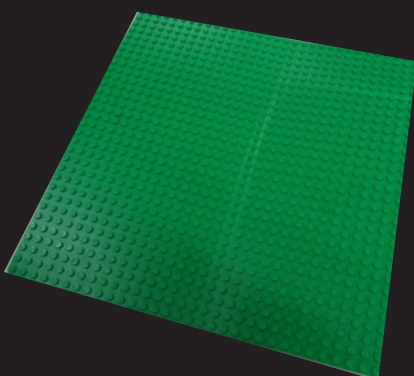
dates, but we are hoping to get together again soon so that things can happen.

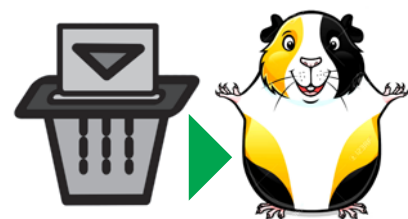
