many factors into account. With the support of everyone involved, I'm sure we will manage this successfully.



I am also excited to announce we will be having a Japanese assistant teacher with us from term two who is part of the Hyogo Exchange Teacher Program through the Department of Education. Hyogo Prefecture is Western Australia's sister prefecture in Japan. The program aims to:

- Build intercultural understanding.
- Support delivery of the West Australian Curriculum.
- Promote the cross-cultural priority of Asia and Australia's engagement with Asia
- Provide support with transition from primary to secondary Japanese language programs.

We will be sharing the Japanese assistant with Newton Moore Senior High School and Kingston Primary School.


### Time to return the Library Books.
