(turning five years old by 30 June 2020)

If your child is four years old by 30 June 2020 you can apply for Kindergarten for 2020. Visit the school front office and apply by 26 July.

#### **Do you need care for your child during the school holidays? We have that covered!**

During the school holidays we have 3 vacation care programs operating from Cooina Primary, Kingston Primary and Tuart Forest Primary. Your child will have so much fun making new friends from different schools and ages! There are always lots of toys/books/activities to choose from everyday along with heaps of fun games and crafts to do for kindergarten all the way to year 6! There is something for everyone!

#### **All About Vacation Care:**

- Each service operates from 7am to 6pm.
- The full fee each day without CCS applied is \$63.90 (we are Centrelink registered so you will be able to claim CCS to help make it more affordable).
- Every day is a different theme with planned crafts, games and experiences for your child to engage with all day with the opportunity for your child to suggest what they want to do throughout the day as well.
- Every week we have a different incursion and excursion.
- Children can (and are encouraged to) get active by going outside to play on the school playgrounds or join in with some fun group games.
- Each service has a variety of games, toys and crafts for your child to engage with if they wish at any time of the day.
- For older children who attend we have a range of games and activities solely for them to use and we encourage leadership and responsibility by giving them the opportunity to mentor and assist their younger peers with games or running craft tables if they wish.

#### **What to Bring:**

Please ensure your child has the following each day:

- A wide brim hat.
- Enough food for morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea.
- A water bottle.
- Wearing enclosed shoes.
- Wearing a shirt/dress that covers their shoulders for sun protection.
- A change of clothes (if required for your child).
