Introducing the lines...



In an effort to bring Mathematics out of the classroom and encourage student interest and interaction, we have painted a 10m x 10m square grid in the centre circle and various lines throughout the school. We plan to incorporate these new features into our Mathematics instruction and we are encouraging students and families to carry out Mathematical investigations of their own.

So please, get involved! See if your family can work out:

- How many squares are on the grid?
- How many people can fit into a single square?
- How many steps it takes to get to the end of one of the lines? What about the other lines? Does it take other people the same number of steps? What happens when you walk backwards?
- Where is the halfway point on your line? Can you break it into quarters? What about thirds? Have a try with a different line...
- What percentage of the grid can your family fill up? How about your whole class? What about the whole school?

Better yet, come up with your own investigations! Submit your findings in writing with supporting photographs and your research may be featured in our next newsletter.

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Room 11 \$ 12 - Visit to ECU

Room 11 & 12 visited Edith Cowan University and were wowed with a science demonstration.

We were invited to Edith Cowan University on Wednesday 15 November by the Science Outreach Programme, which aims to promote science enthusiasm and career paths. This year we were entertained by a professor of atmospheric chemistry from Bristol University, U.K. who gave a talk about gases in the air.

The hour long demonstration was full of colour, humour and of course some loud explosions, which excited the crowd from 3 different schools. The professor melted away polystyrene to show that it is largely full of nitrogen gas. He had liquid nitrogen boiling at -196 degrees Celsius and concepts that we had learnt at school were reinforced. Boiling is the change of state between a liquid and a gas and occurs at different temperatures for different substances.

The professor put all sorts of things into the liquid nitrogen, even a banana which he used as a hammer to bang a nail into

wood. That must have been hard!

We observed changes in a liquid, which when shaken, the long chain sugar molecule mixed with the oxygen in the air and resulted in a chemical reaction where the liquid changed colour.

After the liquid sat still for a few moments it then changed back - just like magic- but we learnt that it's not magic - it's science, we had just observed a reversible chemical reaction.

It was lovely to have the bus trip to and from the University paid for by the Outreach Program. This program has had the opportunity of presenting and influencing more than 5000 students this year, to be more enthused about science, promoting the importance of scientific literacy skills and opening students eyes to the possibility of a career in science. Both adults and students thoroughly enjoyed our trip to E.C.U.
