BOOK SWAP

Does your child have books sitting in their room that they have already read? Then bring them in for a **BOOK SWAP**, an inexpensive way for children to obtain new books, recycle books they've finished and encourage reading for pleasure.

Students may bring their lightly used books to the **BOOK SWAP** trolley located outside the library before school or during lunchtimes and swap for others. i.e. bring 2 books take 2 books etc. students may swap as many books and times as they like.

Swapped books will be kept by students forever so please make sure your child does not bring a book that they will want back.

- Books must be appropriate for years Kindy-6
- Books need to be in good condition
- No colouring books, activity books, or sticker books

Bringing in books to swap for some fresh ones is a great way to get new reading material without spending any money, as well as learning about the value of recycling.

So, start looking for those unwanted but GOOD books!

CARING FOR BOOKS



We love our library and all the library books that are available for borrowing. However, it is really important that good borrowing habits are learned. Can you please make time to go through the following points with your children to help them become responsible library users.

CARING FOR BOOKS:

- Use a library bag.
- Keep books out of the sun and damp places.
- No tearing, scribbling or spilling food onto your books.
- Always put books in a safe place where they can be found. It is particularly important to make sure that books are out of reach of younger brothers and sisters.
- Always have clean hands before you begin to read.

Should your child accidentally damage a book, please let Mrs. Taylor know, she may be able "save" the book. The library has "special tape" for fixing rips and tears. If it is beyond repair (eg wet) a contribution towards replacement would be appreciated.

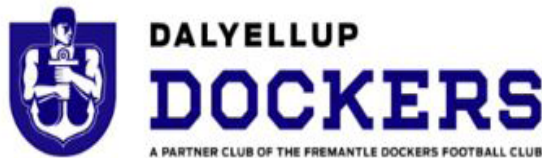

How to install School Star in your smart phones

School Star may be downloaded for both iPhone and Android devices. Installing School Star is easy. Follow the instructions below to download and install the app.

iPhone users:

1. Open the App Store on your iPhone by tapping the icon.
2. Search the App Store for “MGM School Star”.
3. Tap the button that says “+GET”, then “INSTALL”.
4. If asked, enter your Apple ID password.
5. The “INSTALL” button will turn into an indicator that shows the progress of the download.
6. Once the download has finished, tap “OPEN” to launch School Star.

Android users:

1. Open the Play Store on your Android Phone by tapping the icon.
2. Search the Play Store for “MGM School Star”, and tap the search result in the list.
3. Tap the button marked “INSTALL”.
4. The “INSTALL” button will turn into an indicator that shows the progress of the download.
5. Once the download has finished, tap “OPEN” to launch School Star.

After you register a new account, only parents whose phone numbers are registered with the school are permitted to create an account and log in to School Star. School Star will automatically detect your school and check your ID credentials. This means that any posted content is protected and confined to the school community only.

While you are logged in to School Star, any messages sent by the school will arrive as a School Star notification, allowing you to reply to important messages from the school for free.
