**Recycled Sculpture**

Look in your recycling bin to find interesting objects to create a sculpture of your choice. Think of creative ways to hold it all together: tape, glue, string etc



**Favourite Sport Shoes**

Pull your favourite sport shoes out of the cupboard and draw them with as much detail as you can! Use any drawing implement You can find. Pencil, pen, ball point texta etc



**Make a Pet Rock**

Keep your eye out for a nice shape rock that you can turn into a unique, low maintenance pet! You can paint its body or glue on some other body texture. Then give it a name of course!



**Make a Shadow Drawing**

Try waiting until the late afternoon to try this activity. The sun should be low in the sky, then use some favourite toys lined up along the side of your paper and draw around the shadow. You can add extra details to the background after.



**Draw in the POP art style**

Go to the pantry and look at some of the packets of food that is kept there. Choose one that you might like to draw. Try to copy the bright colours and bold black outlines. Artist Andy Warhol made art using this type of subject.



**Complete the Drawing Challenge**

Team up with someone in your house to play a game of "Complete the Drawing" Person 1 makes a creative line on the page. Person 2 then looks at the line to see if it makes them think of something and they can "complete the drawing". Swap

**Transform a toilet roll**

Use your imagination and what materials you can find around the house to turn an ordinary toilet roll into something new!



**Cardboard Castles**

Save up your cereal boxes and boxes of all shapes and sizes to create a castle fit for a princess or knight. Use glue or tape to put it together and add details such as bricks, doors, windows etc



**Make your own modelling clay**

1 cup corn flour  
2 cups Baking powder  
1 1/4 cups cold water  
Non stick pot, wooden spoon, large bowl and damp tea towel

How to make it:

1. Pour all ingredients into the pot and mix until smooth
2. Cook on low-med until the mixture changes consistency and starts to have the texture of mashed potatoes
3. Remove mixture and cool in the large bowl. Place damp cloth over the top to preserve moisture.
4. Once cool begin to PLAY!
5. Allow to harden overnight. Can be painted.

**Scrappy Animal Portrait**

Grab a copy of the local paper and look for light and dark, coloured areas that can build the portrait of an animal of your choice. Pay close attention to the nose and eye shapes
