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FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



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We are continuing to promote the effective use of technology as a learning tool at our school. Our students need to be able to use technology to access and critique information, to create and to become effective users of different digital systems.

We began a BYOD iPad program at the beginning of the year for our Year 4 and 5 students and it is pleasing to see the number of students bringing their own iPad is increasing as we progress through the year. We have recently included Year 3 and 6 students, on a voluntary basis, to this program and already have some of these students bringing their own iPad to use at school.

A recent survey of parents, staff and students involved with the BYOD Program has provided us with useful information to assist us in improving how this program operates. Over 80% of students indicated that they preferred using iPads to pen and paper activities and a similar number believe they learn better when using the iPad. Most acknowledge that they still use pen and paper more than their iPad.

It is important to remember that the iPad will never replace pen and paper and the many other resources students use but will be used when appropriate. Feedback from parents was mixed which is understandable with a significant new program like this one. Like our students we are also learning how to make best use of the technology resources available to us and in this phase there will be varying amounts of use from class to class.

As with other areas of school operations we welcome feedback and are keen to work with students and parents to achieve the best possible outcomes for our students.
