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
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National Simultaneous Storytime

National Simultaneous Storytime is held annually by the Australian Library and Information Association. Every year a picture book, written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator, is read in libraries, schools, pre-schools, childcare centres, family homes, bookshops and many other places around the country. Now in its 19th successful year, it is a colourful, vibrant, fun event that aims to promote the value of reading and literacy, using an Australian children's book that explores age-appropriate themes, and addresses key learning areas of the National Curriculum for Kindergarten to Year 6.

Friday until the end of this term.




2020 ENROLMENTS ARE NOW OPEN

WOOLWORTHS EARN AND LEARN IS BACK IN 2019





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What's been happening in Japanese?



JAPANESE WRITING

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Students have been introduced to the three different writing systems in Japanese – Hiragana, Katakana and Kanji. Through an inquiry lesson, students were able to identify the characters of each script. Students will start learning Hiragana characters this term and will soon be able to write in Japanese script. They are already able to write their names in the Katakana script and numbers in the Kanji.

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On 5 May Japan celebrated the annual Children's Day Festival – Kodomo no Hi. In the past the festival was to celebrate the health of young boys. These days it has become more widely known as Children's Day wishing good health to all children. During the festival, Koi Nobori are flown – Carp Streamers. The black streamer represents the Father, the red the Mother and the blue the eldest son. Also Kabuto or warrior helmets are displayed as a sign of strength and prosperity.

Students in the Japanese classes made their own version of the Koi Nobori and made origami warrior helmets.
