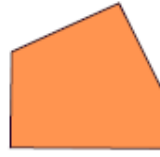

Setagaya Primary School Student Visit

On Wednesday 6 November a group of Primary school Japanese students from Bunbury's Japanese sister city, Setagaya, visited Adam Road Primary School. They performed an amazing traditional dance and sang songs in Japanese and English.

They presented Mr Asser and our school with some gifts which we can use in the Japanese room – a traditional Japanese scroll, origami paper, some traditional toys and some information about the City of Setagaya in Japanese and English.

The Japanese students then enjoyed participating in activities with the Year 5 & Year 6 classes before having lunch with Adam Road Primary School students.

Shichi-Go-San Festival

Last week during Japanese classes, students learnt about a Japanese Festival called Shichi-Go-San. Essentially standing for 7-5-3 years of age, the festival celebrates the growth of children and wishes them continued good health. Girls (aged 3 and 7 years old) and boys (aged 3 and 5 years old) dress in traditional kimono and visit Shinto shrines with their families.

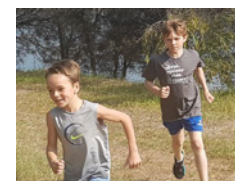
