FUTURE EARTH THEME

On Wednesday, 13 September students participated in a 2 hour whole school activity relating to this year's science week theme of "Future Earth". What sort of problems does our planet face and what can we do about it?

To start us off we had an 11 year old student from Dalyellup speak to the whole school. Bella Burgemeister is passionate about sustainability and has written a book "Bella's Challenge", which was read to all classes before the assembly. It was inspirational to hear her speak and realize that even as kids we can make a big difference to our planet.

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

Students participated in the following activities.

Year 1 students planted salad seedlings and made seed pots from newspaper. They are now looking after their gardens and watching them grow.

Year 2 students made mosaic pictures from coloured bottle tops. These will be displayed along the year 2 corridor and look absolutely amazing.

Year 3 students made useful tote bags from old t-shirts. Perfect as a new library bag. Great to find a useful purpose for something that would otherwise be thrown out.

Year 4 students had fun looking at renewable energy forms. Room 16 made land yachts from recycled materials – lots of testing, redesigning and trying to get the vehicles to travel as far as possible on the least amount of wind energy. Room 13 made axel rovers. These are powered via elastic energy and zoomed along the bitumen really well.

Year 5 students conducted a waste audit on the school rubbish bins. They sorted the rubbish into different types and discovered 19kgs of food waste. They were amazed at the quantity of food in just one day and that whole lunches were thrown into the bin. Imagine how much is wasted when multiplied by 5 and then by the number of school weeks in a year. Let's hope this was an eye opening exercise for them.

Year 6 students could choose from making paper – great for gift giving, or making a basket from old magazines – an intricate weaving exercise to make a useful basket for any number of purposes.

From all reports students had a great time completing their activities that had a strong theme of the 4 R's (there are 4 now, not 3 – refuse, reduce, re-use, re-cycle). Little actions that we do now can help our planet for the future.
