FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



PBS has begun at Adam Road Primary School. PBS, Positive Behaviour Support, is a new program we are implementing at our school from PP to Year 6 to assist all students in managing their behaviour.

As the name suggests the program is based on supporting (acknowledging) positive (appropriate) behaviour. We have developed a behaviour matrix where we have listed the behaviours we expect from our students. These behaviours are categorised under the headings of our five values. Part of the program involves collecting data to determine areas that need improvement and then targeting this behaviour to gain the improvement sought. We have also modified our Values Awards to small brightly coloured business cards that are awarded to students displaying behaviours from our matrix. We will continue to use the consequences currently in place for inappropriate behaviour.

We had another fantastic Faction Carnival last Friday thanks to

the great work of Mr and Mrs Sheedy and many members of our staff. A feature of our carnivals is the high level of participation by all students. The large number and variety of events ensures there is something for everyone and there is a great balance between competition and fun. A small band of P&C volunteers worked hard in providing morning teas and lunches to again raise funds for our students. Thank you.

Every two years we survey our school community to gather feedback from parents/carers, staff and students. These surveys are done online. You will have received an email with a link to complete the survey and I encourage everyone to complete this for us. Symposium Waste Management

On Monday October 22, Room 21 joined with Room 4 to do an audit on the symposium rubbish. We tipped all the rubbish onto a big plastic sheet. It was disgusting and the smell was an assault on our olfactory sense.



It was really awful to see how the students were not putting their rubbish into the correct bins. There was food inside plastic bags, yogurt containers in with the scrunchables and plastic and paper in the food buckets. Not Good!!



We tipped all the rubbish onto a large drop sheet and began to sort it all into the correct bins. We had rubber gloves to protect our hands but it was still pretty gross!! It wasn't long and it was all sorted. Great team work!!



The drop sheet was cleared and all the rubbish was in the correct bins!!

Some of us scrubbed the bins out...they were so clean you could eat out of them!!

It is important to make sure we get our rubbish in the correct bins.



We had a big chat about where things should go:

1. **FOOD WASTE:** Only food stuff in the food waste bucket
2. **SCRUNCHABLES:** Soft plastics like gladwrap, plastic bags (not zip lock) and wrappers can go in the scrunchables bin.
3. **CANS AND GLASS:** Only cans and glass in this bin.
4. **PAPER AND CARDBOARD:** Paper and cardboard only in this bin
5. **GENERAL WASTE:** All other waste goes in this bin (red). Things that have been polluted by food like choc milk cartons, juice boxes, zip lock plastic bags, yogurt containers, straws, cheese and biscuit dip packs all belong here.

So let's think about our health by eating fresh food and let's think about the planet by reducing the amount of waste we produce. This way everyone benefits!


