


#### Student Leader Update

# Structured play options @playtime

This term, the children have been learning how to play hopscotch during playtime. The Year 4 and 5 students have shown great enthusiasm and engagement with the activity. We began by focusing on the basics, such as hopping and jumping in the boxes, before introducing the rules of the game as an added challenge. While mastering these skills has been tricky at times, the children have shown impressive resilience, returning each day with determination to improve and perfect their abilities. Younger students have been practising their skipping skills, as well as learning to take turns while they wait.



### MacqLIT Update

TOur MacqLit program, designed for students in Years 3-6, supports literacy development. A key focus is helping students understand the sounds in words and how different letter combinations represent those sounds. These skills are essential for both reading and writing success.

To reinforce learning, students are encouraged to read their own writing. To further develop their writing skills, we have introduced a Writing Goals Chart, where each student works towards a specific target. Once a goal is mastered, they move on to the next, ensuring steady progress and continuous improvement.

We'd also like to remind all parents of the importance of home reading in supporting your child's literacy development. Just 15 minutes of reading each day can make a significant difference in their learning progress.

To help with this, students in the MacqLit program are encouraged to visit the MacqLit classroom (first green door off the centre circle) between 8:15 and 8:30 AM to exchange their books.
